



### General Eligibility Criteria and Application Requirements

1. Citizen of the United States or eligible non-citizen (US permanent resident, with an Alien Registration Receipt Card (I-151 or I-551c), Other eligible non-citizen with an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from the US Immigration and Naturalization Services showing any one of the following designations: (a) "Refugee," (b) "Asylum Granted," (c) "Indefinite Parole" and/or "Humanitarian Parole," (d) "Cuban-Haitian Entrant," or other eligible non-citizen with a Temporary Resident Card (I-688)). Students studying on nonimmigrant F-1 and J-1 visas are not eligible for this scholarship.
2. Matriculated undergraduate student pursuing a first bachelor's degree in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) disciplines.
3. Have junior or senior standing.
4. Official high school and all official college academic transcript(s) showing a *preferred* GPA of 3.0 or higher.
5. A current resumé.
6. Applicants should be available to be interviewed by appointment.
7. Full-time enrollment (12 UG credits or more per semester) for the 2013-2014 academic year.
8. Enrolled in or planning to enroll in a science education or mathematics education major.
9. Three signed and sealed TU Noyce Confidential Letters of Recommendation from teachers, professors or employers, commenting on the student's overall academic performance, ability to work on a team, and potential as a full-time science or mathematics teacher.
10. Signed National Science Foundation – Towson University Robert Noyce Scholarship/Stipend Agreement to teach two (2) years full-time in a high need school for every one year of Noyce Scholarship received (to be completed after award selection).
11. Signed Master Promissory Note to repay the NSF the amount of the scholarship received plus 5% (annual fixed interest) if full-time teaching services are not met (to be completed after award selection).
12. Students must file a FAFSA form. For any questions, please contact the Project Administrator.
