



FRESHMEN/NON-DEGREE

Any Undergraduate student with less than 30 earned credits is considered a freshman. Freshmen and Non-Degree seeking students are eligible to purchase an Overflow permit *but* are prohibited from parking in core campus Commuter areas before 3pm. Prior to 3pm, those with Overflow permits are restricted to parking in designated Overflow areas at the Towson Center lots and the West Village Garage.

EVENING PERMITS

Evening permits are valid in Commuter and Overflow spaces after 3pm, and Faculty/Staff spaces after posted hours. If you need to be on campus before 3pm, you must purchase a Visitor's permit from one of the pay station kiosks located throughout campus and park in an associated Visitor space.

CARPPOOLING

Students who wish to carpool to campus are encouraged to do so. Any group of students who wish to carpool to campus must complete a Carpool Agreement application form. This form can be found at the Parking & Transportation website. By signing up to Carpool, those in the agreement will share the cost of only one parking permit and use multiple vehicles. However, only one of the vehicles from the Carpool Agreement may be parked on campus at any given time. Please note other limitations associated with a Carpool Agreement as found on the form/website. Individuals who are not participating in the official university carpool program may not share a permit. As such, each individual must have his/her own permit.

HYBRID PERMITS

Parking & Transportation is committed to Towson University's goal of becoming a more 'Green' campus. Commuter students with a Hybrid vehicle are eligible to purchase a parking permit at half the regular price. A Hybrid Vehicle Application form must be submitted and approved prior to the permit purchase. The form can be obtained from the Parking & Transportation website. Please note that Hybrid permits are valid only on the Hybrid vehicle that has been registered.

PURCHASING A PERMIT

Towson University parking permits are purchased online through our website www.towson.edu/parking. You must be registered for classes before a permit can be purchased. Please note that TU will be utilizing the Virtual Permit System for the 2011-2012 academic year. As such, you will not receive a physical hang tag. Your license plate(s) will be used to verify your permit, so please be sure to enter your license plate(s) information correctly when ordering your permit. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW MUCH DO PERMITS COST?

Permit prices are set on an annual basis, semester basis, or a pro-rated cost. Permit prices can be obtained online at the Parking & Transportation website or by calling Auxiliary Services at 410-704-2284.

CAN I PARK WHEREVER I WANT ON CAMPUS WITH THIS PERMIT?

No, you must park in an area where your permit is valid. Commuter permits are only valid in designated Commuter and Overflow parking areas. Overflow permits are only valid in Overflow lots. All permits are also valid in Faculty/Staff spaces after posted hours.

I CAN'T FIND A PARKING SPACE IN THE GARAGES?

Core campus garages are usually full by 10am. If you arrive on campus after this time it is suggested that you proceed directly to the Towson Center or West Village Garage where Overflow parking is available. You may then use the Gold or Black shuttle routes to get to your destination.

I DON'T WANT/NEED MY PERMIT ANYMORE, CAN I GET A REFUND?

Yes, pro-rated refunds will be given for your permit. Visit the Auxiliary Services Business Office in person to receive your refund. Please note that after certain dates for differing types of permits, refunds will no longer be available.

AS A COMMUTER CAN I PARK ON CAMPUS OVERNIGHT?

Yes, Commuter students can park overnight on campus, but only in Overflow lots at the Towson Center. Overnight parking is not permitted on core campus.



COMMUTER STUDENT PARKING

All students of Towson University who do not reside in campus housing (including Millennium Hall) are considered Commuters. Commuters with at least 30 earned credits are eligible to purchase a Commuter parking permit. Designated Commuter parking areas and garages are located throughout the campus (please consult a campus map).
