How to Obtain System Information on a Macintosh

Introduction

Macintosh computers store unique system information for each Macintosh on the hard drive, including: serial number; computer number; operating system, etc. This information is needed when a Macintosh needs service from OTS or Apple. You can access the system information by one of two ways.

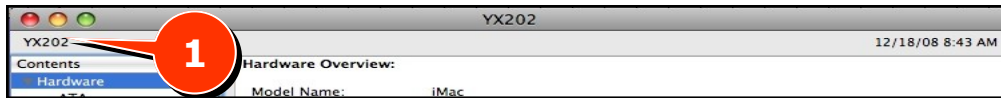

If You are Logged On to a Mac

1. Click on the **Apple** menu in the upper left hand corner of the screen
2. Click **About this Macintosh**.
3. In the **About this Macintosh** window, the Processor and Memory information will be displayed.
4. Click the **More Information** button to launch System Profiler to find more detailed information including the Model Number, Hardware, and Network details.
5. The **computer name** is displayed in the More Information window (Fig. 1) directly underneath the Close, Minimize, and Maximize buttons (Fig. 1,1).

If You are not Logged On to a Mac

1. On the main login window, below the words **Mac OS X**, the computer name is displayed (Fig. 2).
2. For additional information, continue clicking the text below the words **Mac OS X** (Fig 2, 1) and you will see the following information in this order:

- OS Version**
- Build**
- Serial Number ****
- IP Address**
- Network Accounts Available**



(a **red dot** on this item indicates that the Mac is not connected to the network; check to verify network cables are plugged in.)
