The Departments of Economics and Geography/Environmental Planning offer a **double major** program leading to a Bachelors degree with majors in both of these disciplines. **Note that the following courses also count towards General Education Requirements: GEOG 109 applies to Category II.C.2; ECON 202 applies to Category II.B.2. GEOG 102 and GEOG 105 apply to Category II.D.**

**GROUP REQUIREMENTS FOR GEOGRAPHY (6 CREDITS)**

After the required courses, 15 credits in Geography and 12 credits in Economics remain to be taken. **Note that two accepted courses in Economics can count towards the 15 credits in Geography and two accepted courses in Geography can count towards the 12 credits in Economics.** If you follow this route, the double major requires a total of 57 credits.

**ECONOMICS COURSES ACCEPTED  
AS PART OF THE GEOGRAPHY MAJOR (6 CREDITS)**

The Geography/Environmental Planning Department will allow **two** of the following Economics courses to count towards fulfilling the upper-level elective courses in geography and environmental planning required of its majors: ECON 323, ECON 325, ECON 333, ECON 351, ECON 421, ECON 423, or ECON 470-479. ECON 470-479 Topics in Economics requires the approval of Geography/Environmental Planning Department. If ECON 421 or ECON 423 is to fulfill the ECON 400 level core requirement for the economics major it cannot be included in this category.

**ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES IN GEOGRAPHY (9 CREDITS)**
