Internship Eligibility

- Full EMF Majors with at least 60 credits completed (Junior status).
- Completion of courses related to the area of internship concentration:
- EMF 140 and EMF 222 prior to any video or television placement
- EMF 221 and EMF 222 prior to any film placement
- EMF 140 and EMF 265 prior to any radio placement
- Cumulative GPA requirement: 2.75 overall, 3.00 in the major. Waivers are considered by the department.

Grading & Credit Hours

- Your internship experience is graded on a Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) basis.
- It will appear on your transcript as EMF 460: Internship.
- > The formula for academic credit is:
 - 35 hours over the course of the entire semester = 1 unit
 - A typical Internship of 8 hours per week over a fifteen week semester would equal 3 units.

Your internship experience is graded on a Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) basis. It will appear on your transcript as EMF 460: Internship.

Internship Process

- 1. To start an Internship for credit, apply for the internship that works with your schedule.
- 2. Select a full time faculty advisor.
 - Preferably the semester before you plan to Intern.
- 3. Decide how many credits/hours your internship will be.
- Fill out and have your Faculty Internship Sponsor approve the following forms:
 Internship Registration Form and the Learning Plan.
- 5. The other required forms are due at the end of the Internship
 - Work Log, Mid-Semester Evaluation of Intern by Supervisor, End of Semester Evaluation of Intern by Supervisor, End of Semester Evaluation by Intern.
