A second internship can be completed as a KNES required elective. However, the experience must be different from the first internship.
3. **Grade Requirements for Courses in the Major**
A grade of "C" or better must be earned in all courses required for the academic major. If the required grade is not achieved, the course may be repeated without permission a second time. Students may not make a third attempt of a course except with prior approval. Students must complete a *Petition for a Third Attempt Form* before registering for the course.

4. **Graduation Application**

Students must apply for graduation.

To graduate in:	Submit your application by:
May	September 30, of the year prior to graduation
December	May 30, of the year of graduation
August	March 30, of the year of graduation.
