Scholarships, Financial Aid and Estimated Expenses

Scholarships

Students who apply for admission before December 2 will be considered for admission scholarships including the Commonwealth Award, Cultural Diversity Scholarship, Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship and the Provost Scholarship. Honors College scholarships require a separate application to the Honors College that is due by December 2. These competitive scholarships are awarded based on your GPA and SAT/ACT scores. There are many other scholarships available through campus departments and private endowments. For more information about scholarships, visit www.towson.edu/finaid.

Applying for Financial Aid

If you want to apply for all available aid programs, we recommend all of the following application steps below.

1) Admissions-Based Scholarships

The TU Admissions Office offers a limited number of merit-based scholarships to freshman and transfer students who have demonstrated excellence in academics.

To apply for these scholarships, apply for fall admission, and submit your Application for Admission by December 1.

No additional application form is required. Priority is given to the earliest applicants. Scholarship recipients are notified on or around March 1.

2) Grants, Loans, and Work-study Programs

This group includes student and parent loans, TU grants, and many other federal and state aid programs.

To apply for any of these aid programs, you must submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- Apply online every year at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- TU's FAFSA Code is 002099.
- Priority Deadline: Submit the form after January 1 and by February 10.

Several days after you submit it, return to the FAFSA web site, confirm that it was processed and review all comments and the accuracy of your data. Your "Expected Family Contribution (EFC)" must not be blank.

To be considered for many TU and Maryland state aid programs, we must receive your fully processed FAFSA data from the processor by March 1. To meet this deadline, please follow the instructions above.

How can I meet this deadline if my taxes are not done yet?

- Try to complete your taxes early, but if you cannot complete your federal tax return(s) before this deadline, then you should definitely report estimated tax data on your FAFSA.
- If you report estimated tax data, you must either correct the data after you file your taxes or authorize the FAFSA processor to download your final tax data from the IRS.

What should I do if I miss the FAFSA priority deadline?

Submit a FAFSA as close as possible to the deadline.

- Late FAFSA applicants can still apply for student loans and the federal Pell Grant, but if you apply too late, your aid offer may not be ready when your fall bill is due.
- Missing the Priority Deadline eliminates you from consideration for TU based grant funds.
- If you are a Maryland resident, missing this deadline also eliminates you from consideration for many state aid programs.

3) State of Maryland Aid Programs

If you are a resident of the state of Maryland, you can apply for aid from the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC). To apply for many MHEC aid programs, you must only submit a FAFSA by the Priority Deadline, but some MHEC aid programs require additional application steps.

4) Apply for Other TU Scholarships

Other TU Departments also offer scholarships.

5) Apply for Private Scholarships

A wide variety of private organizations offer scholarships including businesses, foundations, and civic organizations.

Note for Transfer Students

Your financial aid will not transfer from your prior school to Towson University, and your aid offers may be different.

If you receive aid from MHEC, you must reassign your awards to TU. Visit <https://mdcaps.mhec.state.md.us>.

If you transfer in spring or summer of 2012, you must add TU's School Code (002099) to your 2011-2012 FAFSA. Visit www.fafsa.ed.gov or call 1-800-4FEDAID.

Transfer Students

Financial aid generally will not transfer from one institution to another. Only your eligibility for a Federal Pell Grant and some state grants may transfer. If you plan to transfer mid-year and have already processed a FAFSA to attend another school during the fall term, you must contact the federal processor (1-800-4FED-AID) and request that your FAFSA results be sent to Towson University's Financial Aid Office.

Admission Policies

Admission Policies for Freshmen

Criteria for Admission

Admission is competitive, based on the applicant pool and available space in the freshman class. High school performance in grades 9–11, as demonstrated by a student's grade point average, is evaluated. Strength and rigor of the curricula are considered. Performance on the SAT R or ACT is also evaluated.

Candidates for freshman admission are expected to complete a college preparatory curriculum in high school, including four units of English, three units of social sciences, three units of science (two must have lab component), three units of mathematics (including algebra I, algebra II and geometry), two units of a foreign language, and six elective units.

Towson defines freshman applicants as students currently enrolled in high school or high school graduates who have never attended college. If an applicant is denied admission, he or she may not attend the university as a non-degree candidate.

Early Admission

A select number of outstanding students are admitted to Towson University after completing their junior year in high school. If you are interested in early admission, you should first consult with the appropriate person(s) at your high school and then arrange for an appointment with Towson's Assistant Vice-President and Director of Admissions.

Advanced Placement

Entering Towson students who score well on the College Board's Advanced Placement tests can receive units and advanced placement in various subjects, including biology, chemistry, computer science, economics, English, French, Spanish, German, government and politics, history, mathematics, music, physics, political science and psychology. In general, scores of 4 or 5 result in automatic credit and/or placement. Students should have their score reports sent directly to Towson University's Office of Admissions.

International Baccalaureate

Students who earn an International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma are eligible to receive sophomore standing and can be awarded 30 units toward their bachelor's degree. Students who earn an IB certificate are also eligible to receive units based on the results of their higher-level exams. Students receive 6 to 8 units for each higher-level exam completed with a score of 4 or above. A score of 5 or above is required for the physics higher-level exam. An official, final IB transcript must be submitted to the Office of Admissions for advanced standing to be awarded.

Admission Policies for Transfer Students

Criteria for Admission

To be considered for transfer admission, a student must have completed a minimum of 30 credits of transferable college-level work and be in good academic standing. This course work cannot include remedial or preparatory courses or non-traditional courses such as Credit for Prior Experience/Learning, Military Science, the College Level Examination Program (CLEP), or DANTES, USAFI or ACE evaluations. Students with fewer than 30 transferable credits must comply with the requirements for incoming freshmen and possess the minimum transfer GPA.

The requirements for transfer admission vary, depending on the total number of transferable credits completed and the cumulative combined GPA from all institutions attended.

Priority admission is reserved for transfer students from a Maryland community college who have earned at least 56 transferable credits, are in good academic standing, and have maintained a GPA that meets the policies set by the Maryland Higher Education Commission and the University System of Maryland. Students who have earned fewer than 56 transferable credits or who are transferring from

an institution other than a Maryland community college will be admitted based upon combined cumulative GPA of transferable credits and space availability.

Upon official acceptance to Towson University, a transfer student must maintain the established cumulative GPA required for admission (inclusive of current course work) and remain in good academic standing at his or her current institution, or the university's offer of admission will be withdrawn.

Any transfer applicant who has attended Towson as a non-degree student must possess at least a 2.00 GPA for all course work attempted through the university, even if the applicant is admissible based on course work completed at other institutions. A transfer applicant who is denied admission may not attend as a non-degree student.

Transfer Waiting List

Wait-listed students are defined as those currently taking the necessary course work to meet minimum transfer standards for admission. Admission may be granted if class space is still available at the end of the term during which the required course work is in progress. The university may not consider summer school course work if it is not completed before registration for new students. The Office of Admissions may not wait-list transfer students for the spring term; applicants must possess qualifying credentials before the November 15 deadline to be considered for enrollment in the spring term. In other words, fall course work may not be considered for spring admission.

Housing, financial aid and specific courses may be limited by the time an official offer of admission is made to students on the waiting list.

Students are encouraged to make alternate plans for admission to other colleges in the event that the university cannot extend an offer of admission due to lack of space at the end of that particular term.

Evaluation of Transfer Credit

A maximum of 90 credits of college work may be accepted from students transferring to Towson University from other institutions. However, no more than 64 credits may be transferred from community colleges or other two-year institutions. Only courses transfer, not grades.

Each student's final 30 units (senior-year work) must be completed at Towson University; the final 15 units must be completed as a degree candidate.

Transfer credit will be allowed for most academic courses completed at any regionally accredited two- or four-year college or university. Courses that are not parallel or discipline-compatible with TU courses do not transfer. In addition, college orientation, developmental/remedial, personal development, technical/occupational and selected business courses do not transfer.

After students are admitted to Towson University and have returned the enrollment contract and fee, they receive a preliminary Evaluation of Transfer Credit from the Office of Admissions. A final Evaluation of Credit will be forwarded when the final grades for the current term are received from the student's most recently attended institution. All final official transcripts are due in the Office of Admissions before the course scheduling date.

Courses that are eligible for transfer from Maryland public community colleges are identified in ARTSYS on the Web, <http://artweb.usmd.edu>.

Family Information Policy

Section 4 of the application is optional. Information provided will be used for the purpose of communicating with parents of students by phone, mail or email (invitations, newsletters, development information). Failure to provide this information will not affect your application for admission, but may result in exclusion from university communications. You have the right to inspect your information and to file a written request to correct or amend any information you believe to be inaccurate or incomplete. Additionally, personal information provided is not generally available for public review; however, from time to time, individuals or companies under contract with the university may have access to information in the course of the service they provide to the university, but those entities are not permitted to use or re-disclose that information for unauthorized purposes.

Application Instructions for Freshmen and Transfer Students

How to Apply

All applicants can apply to Towson using our online application process, the Universal Application, Common Application or return pages 1–6. Complete, sign and return pages 1–6 of the TU Application for Undergraduate Admission along with the \$45 application fee (check or money order made payable to Towson University only) to the Office of Admissions, Towson University, P.O. Box 17614, Baltimore, MD 21297-1614. The application fee is nonrefundable and nondeferrable to subsequent applications. Fee waiver forms are available upon request for students who are unable to pay the application fee.

Freshman Applicant Responsibility

Applicants for freshman admission must make arrangements to have official transcripts for grades 9–11 sent directly to the Office of Admissions. Additional transcripts are also required for final grades. The attached High School Transcript and Recommendation Supplement (pages 7–8 of the application) is provided to assist the applicant with this requirement. Applicants must provide the Office of Admissions with SAT R scores directly through the Education Testing Service in Princeton, N.J. (Towson University's code is 5404). ACT scores, including the writing portion, may be substituted for the SAT R. Scores on high school transcripts are not considered official.

For Transfer Students

Deadline for spring 2012: November 15

Deadline for fall 2012: February 15

Transfer Applicant Responsibility

Transfer applicants must contact the registrar at each transfer institution they attended (even if credits were not earned) and request that their official records be sent directly to the Office of Admissions. Your application will not be complete until we receive these records. We do not accept fax transmissions. Individual transcripts from all institutions are required to complete the application even if the most recent college transcript lists all course work that has been taken.

Transcripts of course work in progress should also be requested in advance to ensure prompt receipt at the conclusion of the term, and must be received before your course scheduling date. Applicants with fewer than 30 credits completed are also required to submit their SAT R scores and complete secondary school transcripts.

It is the applicant's responsibility to make certain that all required documents are forwarded to the Office of Admissions. Incomplete applications or those improperly filed are subject to cancellation. Admission to Towson University is granted to applicants whose academic and personal qualifications give promise of academic success. The university reserves the right to close admissions when no space remains available.

Applying to the Honors College

Students interested in the Honors College must complete the Honors College Application, on page 9 of this booklet, in addition to the TU Application for Undergraduate Admission. Mail the application in the envelope provided to The Honors College, Towson University, 8000 York Road, Towson, MD 21252-0001.

Transcripts from Schools Outside the United States

The Office of Admissions requires that applicants who have attended institutions outside the United States submit an evaluation of their transcripts from the World Education Service (www.wes.org).

If You Previously Attended Towson University

If you previously attended TU as a degree candidate (either full- or part-time), do not fill out this application. Please call the Office of the Registrar at 410-704-2007 for a re-enrollment form.

If you previously attended TU as a non-degree student, you may apply as a transfer student into a full- or part-time degree program by submitting this application. If you have earned 30 or more units, you will be subject to the general admission requirements for transfer students. If you have earned fewer than 30 units, you must make arrangements for the admissions office to receive all secondary school records, such as high school transcripts and SAT R scores, in addition to official transcripts from all previously attended institutions.

If You Previously Received a Bachelor's Degree

If You are Applying with a GED

GED (General Equivalency Diploma) recipients are subject to SAT R minimums and must present a partial high school transcript to be considered for admission. GED recipients without these credentials are referred for placement testing before an admission decision is made.

Credit for Prior Learning

The Office of the Registrar sponsors a Credit for Prior Learning Program through which a student may receive up to 45 units for what has been learned through non-college studies. Participating departments offer units through the following formats: standardized tests, ACE-evaluated instruction, portfolio review, or military courses or experience. Some College Level Examination Program (CLEP) tests are also accepted. Please call 410-704-2471 for more information.

The Honors College at Towson University is a unique community where our most talented students achieve their academic potential. You'll be encouraged to develop your interests, cultivate your talents and achieve excellence in academics, research, service and individual development. You'll also have the opportunity to live and learn with your peers, as you explore the possibilities of what you want to become.

Admission to the Honors College is highly selective. Honors College students make up less than 10 percent of the incoming freshman class, and the 700 active honors students represent about 5 percent of all undergraduate students at Towson University. Freshmen admitted to the Honors College for fall 2011 had an average SAT R score range of 1780–1960 (middle 50%) and weighted high school GPA of 3.87–4.25 (middle 50%). All new freshman and transfer students admitted to the Honors College receive a guaranteed scholarship each year in addition to any other scholarships and grants they may receive. Current Towson University students may compete for a limited number of scholarships.

New freshman applicants: Most Honors College students enter as freshmen during the fall term. All students must complete this application to be considered for admission to the Honors College. Applicants are guaranteed admission if they meet both of the following criteria:

- Weighted GPA of 3.80 or greater
- Score of 1800 or greater on the SAT R

Students who meet only one of these criteria are strongly encouraged to apply, and may be admitted after a more comprehensive review that focuses on course selection and the rigor of the high school curriculum, as well as extracurricular activities and a well-written, thoughtful essay.

New transfer applicants: Transfer students who have completed two or more semesters in college must have a minimum 3.50 college GPA for consideration. Transfer applicants with only one semester of college grades may apply with less than a 3.50 GPA and have their high school record and SAT scores considered as well. Students enrolled in an honors program at their current institution receive special consideration for admission. Transfer students may have a maximum of 6 honors units (in addition to 3 units of Honors English) credited toward their 24-unit honors requirements at Towson University.
