

Nicholas Ziolkowski Memorial Scholarship

Due March 18, 2011*

- Either one \$2,447 scholarship or two \$1223 scholarships will be awarded for the spring 2011 semester.
- Eligibility:
 - You must be a current or entering full time Towson University student
 - You must have served or be serving your country through active duty in any branch of the armed forces or National Guard or You must have served as agents for change through full time service in a non-governmental or governmental organization, like the Peace Corps.
 - Preference will be given to students enrolled in the College of Liberal Arts.
- To apply submit the following to the Department of Political Science by submitting:
 - An application for the Ziolkowski Scholarship (available online or from the department of Political Science);
 - A letter of recommendation from someone in a supervisory position in your area of national service (commanding officer, work supervisor) who can verify your length and type of service and provide a personal recommendation; and
 - An essay that describes the unique ways that your academic and personal values have been shaped by your service to your country. This essay must not exceed 2 double spaced typed pages.

Application for the Nicholas Ziolkowski Memorial Scholarship 2011

A Memorial Scholarship Fund has been established by Tracy Miller in memory of her son, Corporal Nicholas L. Ziolkowski who was killed in action on November 16, 2004, serving his country with the 2nd Marine Division in the fight for Fallujah, Iraq. Ms. Miller is an academic advisor at Towson University and a part time instructor in the American Studies Program. To be eligible for the scholarship you must be:

A current or entering full time Towson University student who has served or is serving your country through active duty in any branch of the armed forces or National Guard; alternatively you may have served as an agent for change through full time service in non-governmental or governmental organizations like the Peace Corps. Preference will be given to students enrolled in the College of Liberal Arts.

In addition to the above criteria, applications will be evaluated on the basis of overall academic performance and their commitment for national service. Finalists for the scholarship may be interviewed by the selection committee. The committee may request formal verification of your national service.
