- **Honors Thesis in Psychology**
 - This option gives students the opportunity to learn in-depth about research in Psychology. Students will take advanced classes in research methods and data analysis over three semesters, as well as complete an honors thesis under supervision of a professor in the Psychology Department.
 - Students must be Junior Psychology Majors with at least a 3.4 Overall GPA and a 3.6 GPA in Psychology. - **Clinical Psychology Area of Focus**
 - Students accepted into the Clinical Psychology Area of Focus will gain valuable hands-on clinical experience through small, specialized classes and internship experiences.
 - To be considered for the program, students must be of junior standing with at least a 3.4 Overall GPA and a 3.6 GPA in Psychology. Students must have completed Introduction to Helping Relationships (PSYC 205) and Abnormal Psychology (PSYC 361). PSYCHOLOGY MINOR: 26 Credits Required in Psychology and Additional Relevant Prerequisite Areas

Minors are required to complete 26 credits in Psychology with a grade equivalent of 2.00 or higher in each course. Of these 26 credits, 14 credits are to be completed in the core courses (PSYC 101 or PSYC 102, PSYC 203 or PSYC 204, PSYC 212 (or 213), PSYC 314 (or 313)). The remaining 12 credits must be used to satisfy **four** of the **six** topic areas listed in the major. Minors must satisfy the relevant prerequisites for individual psychology courses taken.
