



Multi-Agency Cohort Opportunities in the Graduate Reading Education Program

Master of Education in Reading / Reading Specialist Certification and ESOL Endorsement

The purpose of this 36 credit Master of Education in Reading program is to prepare certified schoolteachers for reading specialist certification and eligibility for ESOL teacher endorsement in PreK - 12 education.

The [program](#) will prepare educators to:

- Provide specialized literacy instruction and assessment to students at all levels
- Conduct professional development workshops on literacy topics
- Coach and mentor colleagues
- Advocate for best practices in literacy for students, teachers, and schools
- Interpret literacy research and use it to support teaching and learning

Program overview

- 12 courses (3 credits each)
- 9 required; 3 ESOL electives
- Part-time; Usually offer 3-4 courses per year ([course descriptions](#))
- Variety of formats: Online and in-person
- Clinical Internships (REED 626 & 726) at TU Clinic on campus

Towson University cohort advantages:

- Reduced tuition rates and waived application fee
- 10 online courses + 2 Towson University courses held at the TU Reading Clinic

This cohort is for teachers from a variety of schools and school systems. Tuition reimbursement plans and the number of reimbursable courses per year will vary among school systems. Check with your school or system about its policies.
