

Program Transfer Articulation Addendum

Bachelor's Degree in Public Health

This Program Transfer Articulation Addendum (this “Addendum”) effective as the date of the last signature below, is entered into pursuant to the Umbrella Program Transfer Agreement (the “Transfer Agreement”) dated July 18, 2025, by and between Anne Arundel Community College (“AACC”) and Towson University (“TU” and collectively with AACC, the “Parties”), and is incorporated into the Transfer Agreement. Unless specifically modified in this Addendum, all terms and conditions in the Transfer Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. Should any conflict exist between the Transfer Agreement and this Addendum, the terms and conditions of the Transfer Agreement shall prevail.

This Addendum establishes an articulated transfer pathway (“Pathway”) in which students from the Public Health Professions – Public Health, A.S. at AACC may seamlessly transfer into the Bachelor Degree in Public Health at TU. For each degree program listed, a 2+2 Articulation Agreement shall be attached to this Addendum hereto and incorporated herein detailing the course equivalencies, general education, and major requirements, as well as any special admission and other additional requirements, necessary for AACC students to transfer into the aforementioned Bachelor's Degree in Public Health at TU and successfully complete a bachelor's degree.

For the Pathway included in this Addendum, both Parties agree that faculty representatives from both institutions will meet regularly to engage in ongoing discussion to enhance and strengthen this collaboration and agree to update the Pathway and/or associated 2+2 Articulation Agreement whenever substantive changes in the degree programs listed occur at either AACC or TU.

Notes & Recommendations from Towson University:

- *Core 1 at TU is automatically waived for all transfer students.
- *Students must follow the course selections outlined in this agreement. Failing to complete the specified courses will require them to fulfill remaining requirements at TU and could jeopardize their ability to earn a bachelor's degree within two years.
- *Courses with the ♦ symbol are recommendations only; consult with advising for alternate options to complete all coursework within four years. Course equivalents ending in TLL are general lower-level elective coursework at TU.
- *All TU coursework required for the public health major must be completed prior to internship, including HLTH electives.
- *Students earn 6, 9, or 12 credits and are not paid as interns. Students will be matched with an internship site by the public health internship coordinator. More information can be found in the current TU catalog.
- *BIOL 221/221L and BIOL 222/222L sequence is recommended for students planning a clinical career path.
- *A course number beginning with T or F indicates that it is a lower-level equivalent of an upper-level TU course. These courses will not count toward the TU degree requirement for 32 upper-level units.

Bachelor's degree requirements for all students:

- A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 is required.
- A C grade (2.0 GPA) or higher is required for all major courses and prerequisites.
- 32 credits of the bachelor's degree must be completed at the upper level (courses numbered 300 or above) at TU
