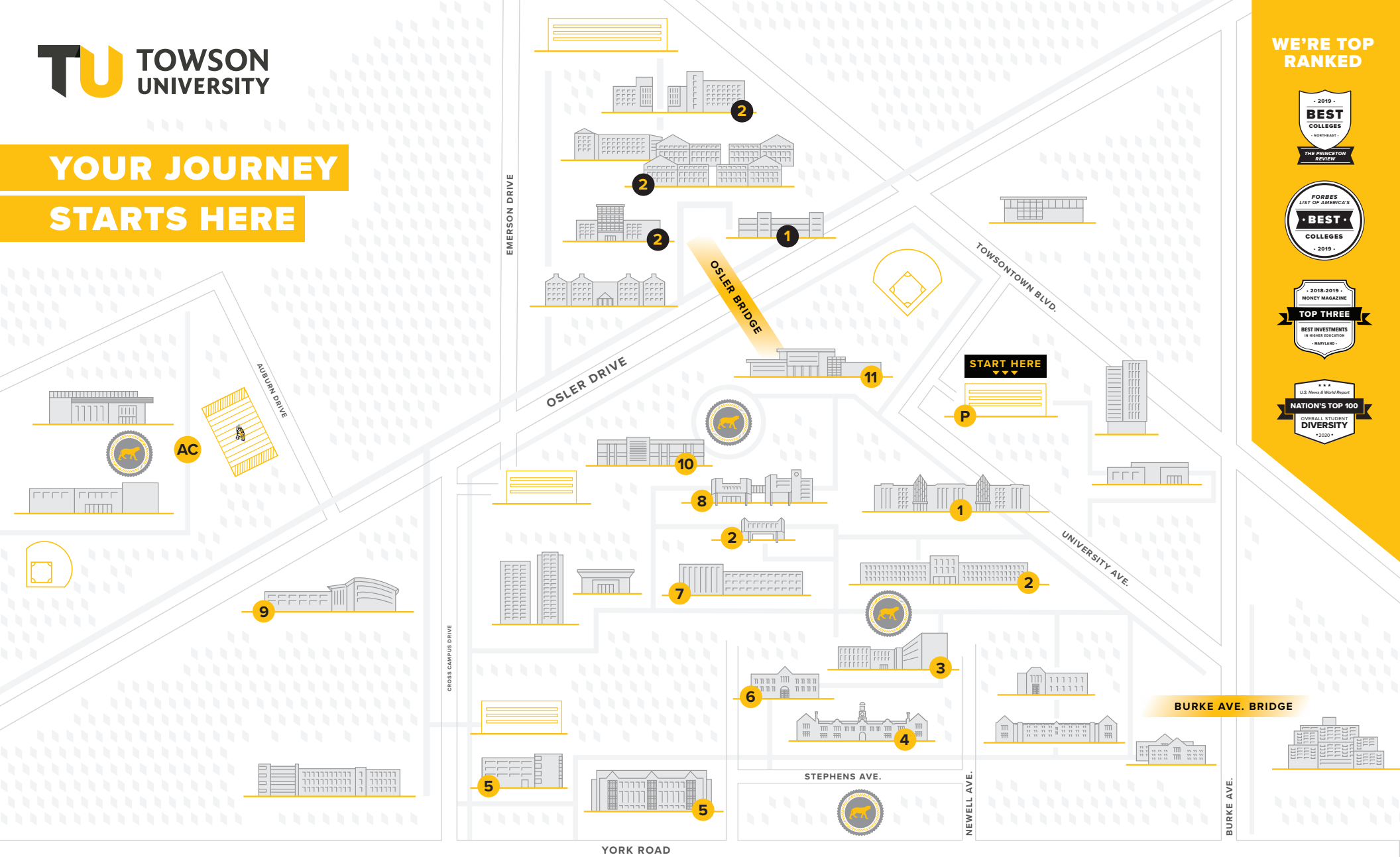

STOP 1: LIBERAL ARTS BUILDING

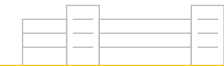
