PROJECT LINC: Preparing School-based Leaders in autism through Interdisciplinary Networking

Towson University's SLP M.S. program is advertising a two-year interdisciplinary training program aimed at preparing future speech-language pathologists and special education leaders to effectively collaborate in servicing students with high intensity support needs and autism in a manner that positively impacts PK-12 student outcomes.

The program is looking to recruit students with interest in servicing students with autism to apply for 9 funded positions. This is a competitive process that will involve an interview following acceptance to the TU SLP M.S. program. Students in the Project LINC program will adhere to a service obligation commitment, which will be outlined in an information session for admitted students.

Project LINC Components:

- Competitive stipend and tuition for specialized summer course
- Interdisciplinary focus
- Coursework and coaching in evidence-based practices for autistic students
- Community of practice
- Mentoring support from current professionals

TU will be hosting virtual open houses for current and prospective students to learn more about this program, the admissions process and how to apply.

We encourage application from a variety of (dis)abilities, cultural, ethnic, race, sex, gender identity/expression, national origin, age, veteran status, color, religious, socio-economic, sexual orientation and belief backgrounds.
