



<u>Associate-to-Bachelor's (ATB) Degree Completion Option – ATB 2.0:</u> <u>Cecil College & Towson University</u>

General Information for the Primarily Online/Hybrid Model - Summer Start

I. General Program Information

This dual enrollment option is available to eligible students after their first year in the Cecil College Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses, grade point average (GPA), and professional conduct during year one of the Cecil College Nursing Program. ATB 2.0 students begin their TU courses in the summer term after the first year of the Cecil College nursing program. Once they earn the Associate of Science (A.S.) degree at Cecil College, students must pass the NCLEX-RN licensure exam and receive their RN license to continue with their remaining coursework at TU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree.

Up to 80% of the TU curriculum may be completed online. The first TU course (NURS 349) and the practicum in the final term (NURS 489) require an in-person component. Other courses are typically offered online; the availability of in-person or hybrid course formats may vary depending on student interest and enrollment.

The ATB program requires year-round attendance, including summer and winter sessions, and takes approximately 2.5 years to complete. It is designed so that students can complete the bachelor's degree in approximately one year after completion of the associate degree. Students also have the flexibility to extend their plan of study after completion of the A.S. degree based on work and personal time constraints. Cecil College courses will be held at the Cecil College campus in North East, MD. TU courses will be taken on the Towson University in Northeastern MD (TUNE) campus in Bel Air, MD, or online.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from Cecil College and B.S. from TU. Students must meet all program and degree requirements at both institutions to receive the respective degrees. Advisors will be available at both schools.

II. Program Admission Requirements

- A. Completion of the first year of nursing course work at Cecil College
- B. GPA of 3.0 or higher and demonstrated professional conduct in Year 1 of Cecil College nursing courses
- C. Completion of additional required courses by the start of the TU ATB program with a C (2.0) or better:
 - Chemistry (CHM 103 & CHM 113) 4 credits (must include a lab)
 - Nutrition (BIO 203) 3 credits

III. General Application Procedures

Students must apply to the TU ATB option by the program's deadline. Students who are admitted to the TU ATB option must also apply to Towson University in order to enroll in classes. The TU Department of Nursing will provide instructions to apply and enroll at the university if admission is offered.

Applying to TU ATB

Students must apply and submit all required materials by the deadline to be considered for ATB admission. Applications may be accepted after the deadline depending on space availability and remaining time until the summer term begins.

Application Deadline:

■ Summer Start – April 1st

Required Materials:

Admission Decisions

The Cecil College and TU Nursing Departments will review completed applications for acceptance into the ATB option. Students will be notified by email and/or letter with their admission decision. Any offer of admission given will be contingent upon successful completion of currently enrolled nursing courses at Cecil College. Students will be required to submit an updated transcript after the completion of the spring term to verify their nursing grades.

IV. Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid

Students will be charged tuition and fees based on the policies of each institution. Tuition and fees are subject to change each academic year. If students are using financial aid, it will be processed through the TU Financial Aid Office based on the total enrollment at both institutions. For the purposes of tuition and financial aid, students must be aware that the ATB plan of study involves part-time enrollment (less than 12 credits) for the majority of the program. V. ATB Program Progression

Students are required to meet regularly with their TU advisor to review their degree plan. Students must follow the TU ATB plan of study, which accounts for factors such as when courses are typically offered and course prerequisite sequences. They may consider taking the upper-level electives in another term only after meeting with their TU advisor.

The completion of the final courses of the ATB curriculum outlined in the plan of study requires successful completion of the A.S. degree and/or active RN licensure. Enrollment in NURS 476, NURS 484, and NURS 489 requires the completion of the A.S. degree. NURS 489 also requires RN licensure and completion of all other courses in ATB curriculum courses (with the exception of NURS 476, NURS 484, and upper-level electives which may be taken concurrently).
