The **Department of Music at Towson University** seeks candidates for an adjunct faculty position in applied organ. The successful candidate will be an accomplished organist and church musician with strong pedagogical and performance skills who sustains professional relationships with local and regional organ teachers and organizations.

Qualifications:

We are seeking candidates with a minimum of a Master's degree in Organ Performance. The ideal candidate should have experience teaching organ at the collegiate level.

Responsibilities:

Work within the keyboard division to teach undergraduate and graduate organ majors, minors, and elective lessons; participate in the weekly keyboard masterclass; serve on audition, recital, and scholarship adjudication panels, as needed. In conjunction with departmental activities, recruit and retain students and develop collaborative relationships with local and regional public and private schools, community colleges, and private organ teachers. Organ faculty is expected to communicate matters concerning organ maintenance to the keyboard division coordinator and chair of the Department of Music.

Application:

A complete application consists of a letter of application, current curriculum vitae, and the names, titles, email addresses and phone numbers for three professional references.
