

Distinguished Scholarships that Support Graduate Study Abroad

What scholarships are available to me?

American Association of University Women International Fellowships. Available to graduate students. Supports community-based projects that build on the student's academic work. **Deadline:** Variable.

The American-Scandinavian Foundation Fellowships and Grants to study in Scandinavia. Available to graduate students in the arts. Provides up to \$23,000 to support research in one of the Scandinavian countries in any field. **Deadline:** November 1.

Blakemore Foundation Language Grants. Available to college seniors or graduates pursuing academic, professional, or business careers that involve the regular use of Japanese, Chinese, Korean, Thai, Vietnamese, Indonesian Khmer, or Burmese. Supports graduate study of the specific language in East or Southeast Asia. **Deadline:** December 30.

Boren Awards for International Studies. Available to graduate students. Provides up to \$20,000 for students to study abroad in areas of the world that are critical to U.S. interests and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East. **Deadline:** January 28.

Critical Languages Scholarship Program. Available to graduate students who are U.S. citizens. Provides fully-funded group-based intensive language instruction and structured cultural enrichment experiences for seven to ten weeks in Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Punjabi, Turkish, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Chinese, Japanese, and Russian. **Deadline:** November 15 for summer 2014 programs.

Fulbright Fellowship. Available to college seniors or graduates. Provides funding for students to undertake graduate study, advanced research, university teaching, and teaching in elementary and secondary schools for one year abroad. **TU Deadline:** September 27.

Gates Cambridge Scholarship. Available to college seniors or graduates. Provides tuition and living stipend for students to pursue a graduate degree at the University of Cambridge in any field. **Deadline:** October 15.

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD: Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst). Available to graduate students. Supports study abroad, senior thesis research, and internships in Germany. **Deadline:** Variable, depending on the program.

Samuel Huntington Public Service Award. Available to graduating seniors. Provides \$10,000 for a student to pursue one year of public service anywhere in the world. **Deadline:** January 18.

Kosciuszko Foundation Year Abroad. Available to graduate students who are U.S. citizens and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Supports semester and year-long Polish language studies at the Jagiellonian University in Cracow. **Deadline:** January 5.

Learning Enterprises Teaching Abroad Program. Available to graduate students and recent college graduates. Provides the opportunity to teach conversation-based English language classes for four to eight weeks in the summer in Mongolia, China, Romania/Croatia, Hungary/Slovakia, Mauritius, Thailand, Turkey, Panama, Poland, Brazil, or India. **Deadline:** January 15 (priority) or February 15 (regular).

Marshall Scholarship. Available to seniors and college graduates with a final cumulative GPA of at least 3.7. Supports up to 2 years of graduate study in any field at any university in the United Kingdom. **Deadline:** October 1.

Ministry of Education Huaya Enrichment Scholarship. Available to seniors, college graduates, and graduate students. Supports three months of the study of Mandarin in Taiwan. **Deadline:** March 31.

Distinguished Scholarships that Support Graduate Study Abroad

What scholarships are available to me?

George J. Mitchell Scholarship. Available to college seniors or graduates under the age of 30. Provides tuition and living stipend for one year of post-graduate study at any university in Ireland or Northern Ireland. **Deadline:** October 1.

Princeton-in-Asia. Available to recent college graduates. Supports one year of service in the fields of education, journalism, international development (NGOs) or business in Burma, Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Japan, Kazakhstan, Laos, Malaysia, Mongolia, Nepal, The Philippines, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, Tajikistan, Thailand, Timor-Leste, and Vietnam. **Deadline:** November 15.

Rhodes Scholarship. Available to graduating seniors and recent graduates who are between the ages of 18 and 24. Provides tuition and living stipend to students pursuing a graduate degree in any field at the University of Oxford. **Deadline:** October 1.

Rotary District and Global Grants. Available to seniors and college graduates. Supports small and large activities that address needs in the local and global communities. **Deadline:** Variable, depending on the grant.

Teach and Learn in Korea. Available to recent graduates and graduate students who are native speakers of English. Supports students who teach English in after-school classes of Korean elementary schools for 6 months or a year. **Deadline:** Variable, depending on the program.
