## **Advising**

**Incoming freshmen** and all other new college students, regardless of class standing, participate in the First-Year Experience (FYE) Program. Students in the FYE program are assigned advisors trained in the university and Honors curriculum, and grouped based on intended major. These advisors work with students in groups and one-on-one with general adjustment to college, scheduling, curriculum, and anything else.

**Sophomores** have at least two advisors: a faculty advisor through their academic major(s) and an Honors advisor, Dr. Adam Rudolphi. Students with minors or multiple majors may have additional advisors. Some screened majors – those requiring special admission, like business administration or nursing – use professional staff advisors rather than faculty advisors during the sophomore year.

**Juniors and seniors** continue to work with their faculty advisor(s) in their major(s), and Dr. Alison McCartney or Dr. Terry Cooney serves as their Honors advisor now that they are considering experiential learning opportunities like internships, independent research, and study abroad.

Honors students complete a series of courses (see below) across four categories to supplement, and often overlap with, their major and Core requirements. All 100 and 200-level Honors courses fulfill a Core requirement, as do some 300 and 400-level seminars. Opportunities pursued for Experiential and Advanced Learning credit may fulfill major requirements, depending on the major and whether prior Honors and major department approval is received.

Honors requirements vary based on class standing at time of admission and college/AP/IB credits earned and submitted to Towson University. Students joining from high school must complete 24 or 21 units across four categories. Each of these students must take an Honors Towson Seminar course and most take Honors English. Students transferring from college must complete 15, 21, or 24 units across three or four categories, depending on amount and type of college credits transferred to TU.
