ABOUT TOWSON UNIVERSITY

Towson University (TU) is one of the nation's top 100 public universities. Located north of Baltimore, TU currently enrolls over 20,000 students and is the second-largest university in the prestigious University System of Maryland. Towson University values diversity and fosters a climate that is grounded in respect and inclusion to cultivate the intellectual and personal growth of the entire university community. Half of incoming TU students enter as transfer students, and 50% of the undergraduate student body identifying as students of color.



The city of Baltimore is Maryland's largest city and economic hub, known for its beautiful harbor; quirky, diverse neighborhoods; unique museums; summer festivals, and crabs! The city of Towson, in the northern suburbs of Baltimore, provides a wide range of shopping, dining, and entertainment within walking distance of campus.

ABOUT OUR INTERN POSITION

Our NODA Intern will serve as an integral member of the professional staff during our mandatory, one-day summer orientation program for freshman student, transfer students, and their families. There will be 3-4 sessions per week throughout the summer. The NODA intern will also help plan our freshman and transfer fall welcome week (Welcome to TU).



The NODA Intern's primary role will include the supervision and assessment of our student leader team (including 4 student interns, 10 returning Orientation Leaders, and ~35 new Orientation Leaders), and facilitating the orientation programs. Additionally, the NODA Intern will gain experience working with orientation leader training, first-year experience, and initial planning for the 2025 Towson University Family Weekend. NODA intern responsibilities and tasks are chosen collaboratively with the supervisor to create an individualized learning experience.

ABOUT OUR IDEAL CANDIDATE

Qualified candidates must have experience with orientation and transition, student leadership development, and/or planning and implementing programs.

Preference will be given to candidates who have an understanding of student development theory and have experience with training and the evaluation of student leaders. Candidates must be able to work in a fast-paced environment that requires multi-tasking, taking initiative, flexibility, and a good sense of humor.


